IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVES

The Saluda High family is forever seeking ways to provide the best education possible to all of our students. We continue to use TIGER Club (Tracking Individual Growth of our Educational Responsibilities), Mentor and PLC (Professional Learning Community) and SCORE (Saluda Creates Opportunities for Real Effectiveness) programs to assist students. SHS added Virtual School Academy and the conception of Saluda Middle School College to assist the already positive initiatives at SHS.

Saluda High School received accreditation through the AdvanceEd site evaluation. process.



Paul Johnson –Science Teacher at SHS- named District Teacher of the Year-One of five finalist for S.C. Teacher of the Year and named the American Legion Department of S.C. 2013 Teacher of the Year.

- SHS guidance department has been working tirelessly in creating positive change for the betterment of our students, as well as their parents. For the fourth consecutive year, the guidance staff was able to boast 100% completion of all individual graduation plan (IGP) meetings for students and parents. In addition, Dr. Bryan Vacchio and Mrs. Yolanda Moore created and implemented new programs to both facilitate and enhance student achievement. Two of the most noteworthy programs are SHS's Virtual School Academy and the conception of Saluda Middle College, slated to begin this fall. Furthermore, Facebook page continues to be a viable avenue of dispersing important, timesensitive information to students and parents.
- Two boys Varsity Basketball players were recognized at the High School Sports Report Winter All-State Banquet, at Seawell's in Columbia. One of these players recognized as a member of the 2012-2013 All Rookie Team. The other player recognized as a member of the High School Sports Report 2012-2013 AA All State Team. One varsity football player invited to play in the Under Armour Combine game in St. Petersburg Florida. Cross Country made history that both girls and boys teams qualify for the SC High School League State Championship.
- Building Construction intro classes have built model scale houses, Adirondack chairs and are working on building decorative lamps. Level One classes have built ceramic inlaid tables, porch glider swings, cedar furnishings and are working on finishing a produce stand that will be stationed in downtown Saluda. The senior class has wired, installed interior/exterior lights and interior/ exterior receptacles in the band storage building.
- The Junior Achievement classes had another successful year, with well over \$5000 in sales.
- SHS Beta Club was involved in multiple charitable projects: Breast Cancer Awareness, Pennies for Patients, St. Jude Children's Research as well as assisting at this year's Special Olympics.
- NJROTC student ranked First in Area Six Rifle Championship and placed 8th in the National Championship.



Four HOSA students placed 3rd in the Creative Problem Solving category at the State HOSA Conference. They will compete this summer at the National HOSA conference in Nashville Tennessee .

The graduating class of 2013 has one Palmetto Fellows Scholar to date. This is the highest scholarship honor awarded by The State of South Carolina. This senior class is actively working on rivaling last year's record breaking scholarship total by the SHS Class of 2012. As of mid-April, we have received notices of 70 college acceptances for at least 33 students and more acceptance letters are coming in each day.




