IMPROVEMENT INITIATIVES

The Saluda High family is forever seeking ways to provide the best education possible to all of our students. We continue to use Mentors, PLC (Professional Learning Community) and SCORE (Saluda Creates Opportunities for Real Effectiveness) to assist students and teachers. SHS continues to expand its Virtual Academy and added the Saluda Middle School College this year to allow our student yet another educational opportunity.

SHS guidance department continues working tirelessly in what has proven to be a banner year in our office. 2013-14 marks the first year of our hybrid master schedule creation & implementation, and we are already seeing a improvement in overall grades. This endeavor has attracted the attention of school administrators from across the state, having already entertained visitors from two school districts looking for similar success in their high schools. In addition, two key programs are up and running which facilitate and enhance student achievement. SHS's Virtual School Academy has received statewide acclaim, and SHS Director of Guidance, Dr. Bryan Vacchio, will be sharing his vision of the integrated online/traditional school model at this year's SC Education & Business Summit. Furthermore, Saluda Middle College boasts an initial class of 10 students, working towards their high school diploma and associate of arts degree concurrently. Moreover, for the fifth consecutive year, the guidance staff is able to report 100% completion of all individual graduation plan (IGP) meetings for students and parents.

- One boys Varsity Basketball player was named Region Player of the Year and 1st Team All-Lakelands. A Girls Varsity Basketball player was named All Region and HSSR All State. One girls tennis player was named Region Player of the Year with a 10-0 record and named to the All Lakelands team. Three additional girls tennis players received All Region honors as well. Two varsity football players played in the North South and Shrine Bowl All Star Games. Four other varsity football players were named to the All Region team and three received All Region honorable mentions. One varsity football player was invited to play in the Under Armour Combine Game in St. Petersburg Florida for the 2nd consecutive year. Two football players, one baseball players, and one male golfer signed National Letters of Intent to play collegiate sports.
- The Junior Achievement classes had another successful year, with well over \$3600 in sales. Donated 25% of profits to local charity.
- **SHS** Beta Club continue to be involved in multiple charitable projects: Breast Cancer Awareness, Pennies for Patients, St. Jude Children's Research as well as assisting at this year's Special Olympics.
- NJROTC Rifle Team place fourth in the Area Six Rifle Championship



HOSA had a total of 21 students to place 1st, 2nd and 3rd in various categories at the State HOSA Conference. A student was named Vice President of the SC HOSA for the 2014-2015 term.

The graduating class of 2014 has three Palmetto Fellows Scholars to date. This is the highest scholarship honor awarded by The State of South Carolina. This senior class is actively working on rivaling last year's record breaking scholarship total by the SHS Class of 2012. As of mid-April, we have received notices of 100 college acceptances for at least 40 students and more acceptance letters are coming in each day. Students are being accepted to colleges as far north as West Virginia and as far west as Oklahoma. One student has received the Teaching Fellows Scholarship.

Art student received 2nd Place in the S.C. Reel Art Fish Contest, another received an honorable mention . One student received honorable mention in the S.C. Jr. Duck Stamp Art Contest.

SHS had 31 of 60 seniors that participated in the HSTW Assessment in February 2014, receive an Award of Educational Achievement. Students qualify for the award by completing a college-preparatory course of study in at least two of three subject areas and meeting readiness goals in all three subject areas of math reading and science.

The Broadcast Journalism student won the high school division of the Lander University Film Festival.

FFA Judging team placed 2nd in state competition at Clemson University. One student was named high individual out of all students competing across the state and one placed 3rd in Dairy Handling. FFA students visited the SC State Legislator for FFA Legislators Appreciation Day. These students had a chance to visit with Representative Ralph Kennedy, Senator Shane Massey and Senator Floyd Nicholson to discuss the state of agriculture in SC.

Three band students were named to the prestigious SC Band Director's Association Region Band.
