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

Counseling Department

The 2021-2022 school year brought similar challenges to the ones faced since March, 2020, but we were able to ensure access to rigorous and relevant coursework for each one of our students, whether they were able to attend school or had to learn from home for a period of time. Our dual enrollment relationship with Piedmont Technical College has reached all=time highs in student enrollment, as a "tuition-free" initiative was set in place at PTC earlier this school year. Dr. Bryan Vacchio and Mrs. Brandi Black conducted information sessions for each grade level, which were licestreamed on the SHS Counseling Facebook page, in an attempt to reach all SHS parents & students. The graduating class of 2022 has 4 Palmetto Fellows Scholars to date.

Over 70 percent of our students receives free or reduced lunch, which qualifies us as a Title I school. As a result of the emphasis, we established a Focus Intervention Team that meets biweekly to identify the students' needs and put interventions in place that will address them.
