- Saluda Middle School (SMS) is helping all students develop the world-class skills characteristic of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate. We provide a safe, academically challenging, and supportive learning environment for every student.

- SMS had 91 students earn a high school bearing credit in 2016 17 school year compared to only 14 students the previous year.
- SMS had a higher percentage of students that scored "met" or "exemplary" on SCPASS for 7th grade Social Studies (75%) than the state average (72.3%).
- 70.5% of all students scored "met" or "exemplary" on Social Studies SCPASS. This percentage was very close to the state average for all schools in SC of 72.3%.
- 43.3% of all students scored "meets" or "exceeds" on Science SCPASS. This percentage was close to the state average for all schools in SC of 48.7%.

School Achievements (cont.)

• Jakenjah Caroll finished first in the long jump, 200m Dash and 4x100m Relay team. Jasmine Meetze finished 2nd in the pole vault. Allie Gibson and Skyla Springs finished in third place on the 4x800m team at the Lakelands Track Invitational.

Additional Information

- We have Olweus, a bullying prevention program that challenges students to be observant of what is bullying. This program is done during power period.
- We believe that it is imperative that all students feel welcome and safe in all areas of our school while having an opportunity to grow the necessary soft skills for the future.
- Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a program that supports our school culture. PBIS prepares students for success, acting responsibly, working cooperatively, and showing respect.
- Student leadership worked throughout the year to improve school environment, surveying students, and improving school morale.
- To assist struggling students and families, SMS collaborates with Saluda County Behavioral Health to provide individualized counseling and services.
