SIC ANNUAL GOALS

Goal 1 – In ELA (English Language Arts, Writing, Math, Science, and Social Studies) increase the number of students scoring Met and above on PASS by 1% and the number of students scoring Exemplary on PASS by 2% each year over the next 5 years.

Increase the frequency of technology integration and the number of students engaged with technology over the next 5 years.

Goal 2 – Improve school climate by the previous school year by targeting a 3% decrease in discipline referrals each year over the next 5 years.

Goal 3 – Increase teacher morale by 3% each year over the next 5 years.

Goal 4 – Increase teacher retention rate by 2% each year over the next 5 years.

Note** During the 2015-2016 school year, we will collect baseline data for Reading, Writing, and Math from the newly mandated state assessment, Aspire students will take in Spring 2015.

Comparison to other Anderson 5 Schools

Whitehall Elementary was named a Rewards School for Performance as one of the highest performing Title I schools in the state in 2014. Whitehall is **ranked** 3rd out of the 10, Anderson School District 5 elementary schools by the ESEA Federal Accountability Averages. Whitehall earned a **Grade**A with a 98.8 average.

Whitehall is one of four Title I elementary schools in Anderson School District 5. In both of the above categories, Whitehall **ranked 1**st among the elementary Title I schools in student performance.

In addition, Whitehall is **ranked 5**th out of the 10, Anderson School District 5 elementary schools with a 3.54 Absolute Rating Index Level, earning an **Excellent** Rating. An **Excellent** rating means Whitehall students substantially exceeded the standards for progress toward 2020 SC Performance Vision.

Technology Integration

Whitehall students work with technology each day. Putting technology in the hands of students aligns with our School Renewal Plan and our Global School Curriculum. Each grade level has a cart of 30 iPads used to support instruction. Students also have access to a computer lab and 4 mobile laptop carts each containing 30 laptops, and 2 Chromebook carts each containing 30 Chromebooks. Students practice skills, read books, conduct research, create projects, communicate via Skype, and take assessments all with technology.
