Comparison to other Anderson 5 Schools

Whitehall Elementary is **ranked** 3rd out of the 10, Anderson School District 5 elementary schools by the ESEA Federal Accountability Averages. Whitehall earned a **Grade A** with a 97.8 average.

In addition, Whitehall is **ranked 4**th out of the 10, Anderson School District 5 elementary schools with a 3.54 Absolute Rating Index Level. Whitehall earned an **Excellent** Rating. An **Excellent** rating means Whitehall students substantially exceeded the standards for progress toward 2020 SC Performance Vision.

Whitehall is one of four Title I elementary schools in Anderson School District 5. In both of the above categories, Whitehall **ranked 1**st among the Title I schools in student performance.

Technology Integration

Whitehall students work with technology each day. Putting technology in the hands of students aligns with our School Renewal Plan and our Global School Curriculum. Each grade level has a cart of 25 iPads used to support instruction. Students also have access to a computer lab and 4 mobile laptop carts containing 30 laptops. Students practice skills, conduct research, create projects, communicate via Skype, and take assessments all with technology.
