SIC ANNUAL GOALS

SCReady assessment results from Spring 2016 are considered baseline data because students in Grades 3 - 5 were tested for the first time in Reading, Writing, and Math using this assessment. The SCPASS assessment for Science and Social Studies was given to students in Grades 4 – 5 only for the second year. This data can be compared to the Spring 2015 administration. Because of the new SCReady assessments, schools were not given an accountability rating on this year's State Report Card.

Goal 1 – The percentage of students in grades 4 - 5 who score Met and above on SCPASS Science and Social Studies will increase 1% each year over the next 2 years. The percentage of students who score Exemplary on SCPASS will increase 2% each year over the next 2 years.

Increase the frequency of technology integration and the number of students engaged with technology over the next 5 years.

Goal 2 – Improve school climate by the previous school year by targeting a 3% decrease in discipline referrals each year over the next 5 years.

Goal 3 – Increase teacher morale by 3% each year over the next 5 years.

Goal 4 – Increase teacher retention rate by 2% each year over the next 5 years.

Comparison to Other Anderson 5 Schools

Whitehall ranked 1st among the four Anderson Five Title I elementary schools in overall school performance in ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies

Out of all 10 elementary schools in Anderson Five, Whitehall ranked 3rd for students who Met Expectations in Math and ranked 5th for students who Exceeded Expectations in Math. Whitehall students ranked 5th for students who Met Expectations in ELA and ranked 4th for students who Exceeded Expectations in ELA. Whitehall ranked 5th for students who Met Expectations in Science and Social Studies.

Technology Integration

Whitehall students work with technology each day. Putting technology in the hands of students aligns with our School Renewal Plan and our focus on global citizenship. 5th Grade has 1 to 1 technology with each student assigned a Chromebook. Grades 3 and 4 have 1 to 1 with each student having access to either a Chromebook or laptop. In addition, each grade level has a cart of 30 iPads used to support instruction. Students also have access to two computer labs. Students work on assignments in Google Classroom and use technology to practice skills, read books, conduct research, create projects, communicate, and take a variety of assessments that monitor student progress.
