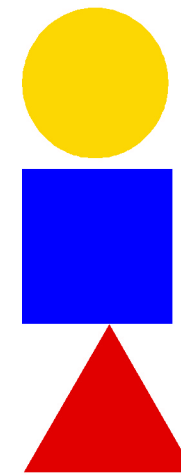

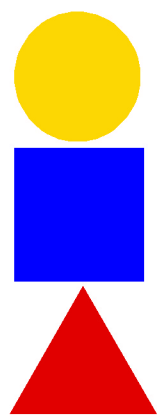

Review of 2010-2011 Goals - Curriculum

- Reading/ELA and Math Instruction had two main components: Whole Group Instruction and Small Group Instruction. Whole Group Instruction is grade level standards based and Small Group Instruction is based on the individual needs of the students.
- All teachers implemented "Thinking Maps" into their daily instruction.
- Science and Social Studies teachers implemented "Interactive Notebooking" in their classroom instruction.
- All teachers participated in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to identify Math and ELA Power Standards and to discuss assessments and student data.
- Ongoing training was provided for all teachers in our Balanced Literacy program as well as the Write From The Beginning program, a writing initiative implemented in K-5th Grade.
- All math teachers implemented a problem solving based "Math Inquiry" time during their math instruction.
- High quality assessments were created in kindergarten – fifth grade to assess state curriculum standards. Assessment scores were evaluated to help recognize both strengths and weaknesses in the curriculum. This information was utilized for setting improvement goals and to drive whole group and small group instruction.
- A monthly reading incentive program for all grade levels enhanced students reading performance. This initiative encouraged students to read for pleasure and to improve comprehension.
- Hollywood benefited from a phenomenal sheltered ESOL program for our Hispanic students.
- All kindergarten students participated in a Spanish 101 class for thirty minutes each day.
- A 21st Century Technology Teacher in the computer lab worked closely with the teachers to enhance the students' academic and technology skills. Students were charged with developing power point presentations as well as designing group web pages.

School Renewal Plan Goals for 2010-2011

- Hollywood will continue the MAP assessment in grades 1-5 and PASS testing for students in grades 3-5.
- Individual conferences will be held throughout the year with all parents, students, and administration to discuss student performance.
- Fully implement Balanced Literacy and Balanced Math in kindergarten through fifth grade.
- Teachers will continue to create standards based assessments and analyze assessment data to drive their classroom instruction.

School Environment

- Hollywood is a Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) school in its first year of implementation. It is a priority of our school community to reinforce positive behaviors while constantly teaching our school-wide expectations. Hollywood ROCKS: Students are expected to be Respectful, Organized, Cooperative, Knowledgeable, and Safe. This initiative coupled with student leadership opportunities and community service projects helps to foster positive academic and social growth.
- Students will continue to be motivated with the aid of our morning announcements. These are generated specifically for each day and broadcasted throughout the school on the "BUZZ Morning Show."
- Teachers are better able to serve their students with the new technology that is in place. We have a state of the art computer lab for all students to use. All classrooms have a Smartboard which is an interactive board that makes learning fun for all students.
- A volunteer tutoring program has helped serve students in the areas of math and reading. Volunteers have logged over 500 hours working in and around the school.
