Our parent's organization (PACE) continues to be a major part of our school. Working together, we are able to sponsor various events for our students. PACE is also able to contribute to some of our major projects such as school beautification and sponsored field trips for all students in pre-kindergarten - fifth grade. PACE provided a class set of Chromebooks that will be used by the related arts classes in our school.

Community Outreach

- Our school community participates in commendable service learning projects. The St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, the local animal shelter and the American Cancer Society all benefited from our generous support.
- Weekly school and class newsletters are sent home to keep parents up to date on all events.
- Blackboard Connect, a district-wide automated call system, notifies school community members of district and school happenings.
- School website and Facebook Page update the community on school happenings.

Curriculum

- Fully implemented South Carolina College and Career Ready Standards throughout each grade level.
- Fully implemented Balanced Literacy/Literacy Footprints in all grades, K through 5th grade.
- Computers and I-pads are used in kindergarten and first grade to help develop readiness skills.
- Second through fifth grade students have 1:1 devices. Students practice skills in English Language Arts (Reading Eggs) and Math (Reflex Math) daily.

- NWEA'S Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) is administered to all students. Data collected from MAP is used to drive instruction.
- Assessment scores are evaluated to help recognize both strengths and weaknesses in the curriculum. This information is also used for helping students set improvement goals.

- All teachers participated in professional development that is driven by student data. This initiative enabled teachers to work together to learn best practice strategies that are relevant to student needs.

- Teachers focused on implementing strategies to foster vocabulary development in the classrooms.

- A monthly reading incentive program is underway for all grade levels to enhance their reading performance. This initiative encourages students to read for pleasure and for better comprehension.

- Hollywood benefits from a phenomenal sheltered ESOL program for our Hispanic students. ESOL students receive further support provided by ESOL tutors.

- MAP assessment in grades K-5 and SC Ready and SCPASS testing for students in grades 3-5.

- Individual conferences are held throughout the year with all parents, students and administration to discuss student performance.

School Data

- Students in fifth grade ELA scored 6.9% higher than the state average on SCREADY.
- Students in fifth grade math scored 21.5 % higher than the state average on SCPASS.
- Students in third grade math scored 7.2% higher than the state average on SCREADY.
- ESOL students scored 9.3% higher than the state average on meeting progress toward proficiency targets.

School Environment

Hollywood is a Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) school. In our ninth year of implementation, it is our priority to reinforce positive behaviors while constantly teaching our school wide expectations. Hollywood ROCKS: Students are expected to be Respectful, Organized, Cooperative, Knowledgeable, and Safe. This initiative coupled with student leadership opportunities and community service projects helps to foster positive academic and social growth.
