

EXCELLENCE IN ACADEMICS

- Approximately 221 students participated in job shadowing and mentoring experiences.
- Approximately 200 seniors participated in College Application Day.
- One hundred-thirty 9th graders participated in Ropes Courses at Swofford, working on team building and trust activities.
- A total of 441 eleventh and twelfth graders participated in the CHS Career Fair.

STATE END-OF-COURSE (EOC) EXAMS

The examinations, which count 20 percent of the students' final grade in each gateway or benchmark course, include *Algebra 1/Algebra 1B*, *English 1*, *Biology*, and *US History*. Chapman's overall passage rate for the 2015-16 school year was above the state scores. Chapman's EOC scores indicate that students had a passage rate of 90.8% in Algebra 1 (state 81.9%), 91.4% in English 1 (state 78.6%), 89.9% in Biology (state 75.7%), and 80.7% in US History (state 71.0%).

Strategies for continued improvement on EOC scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

SAT

Seniors in the 2016 graduating class who took the SAT scored an average composite score in critical reading, writing, and math of 1398. South Carolina seniors' average composite score for math and critical reading was 1446 and the national composite score was 1453.

ACT

Seniors in the 2016 graduating class who took the ACT scored an average composite score of 17.9. South Carolina seniors' average composite score was 18.2.

ATTENDANCE DATA

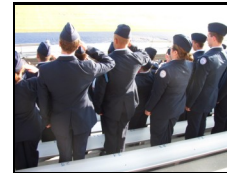
Based on the 135th day attendance count, the average daily enrollment is 857. The 2016-2017 percentage for student attendance is 93.33%.

EXCELLENCE IN ARTS

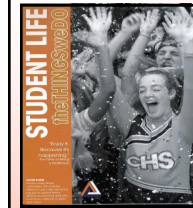

Chapman's yearbook, *Panorama*, was recognized for excellence and featured in the 2017 Jostens *Look Book*—celebrating the best-of-the-best in yearbook design and coverage—for the second year in a row. The *Look Book* is a collection of spreads and photos from outstanding yearbooks and their creative themes, cool covers, dazzling designs, relevant coverage, storytelling copy, and action-packed photography. The Chapman High School *Panorama* was one of only 418 yearbooks selected from approximately 3,000 nationwide.
