2017—2018 Spotlight on Excellence

- The Class of 2018 had 203 seniors who earned their diplomas.
- The Class of 2018 reported \$3,596,534 in scholarships.
- Eight seniors received the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship.

STATE END-OF-COURSE (EOC) EXAMS

The examinations, which count 20 percent of the students' final grade in each gateway or benchmark course, include English 1, Algebra 1, Biology, and US History. Chapman's overall passage rate for the 2017-18 school year was above the state scores. Chapman's EOC scores indicate that students had a passage rate of 86.8% in English 1 (state 80.7%), 68.5% in Algebra 1 (state 68%), 76.7% in Biology (state 67.5%), and 81.2% in US History (state 71%).

Strategies for continued improvement on EOC scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

SAT

Seniors in the Class of 2018 who took the SAT scored an average composite score in critical reading, writing, and math of 1055. South Carolina seniors' average composite score for math and critical reading was 1064 and the national composite score was 1068.

ACT


Seniors in the 2018 graduating class who took the ACT scored an average composite score of 19.2. South Carolina seniors' average composite score was 18.3.


