- Approximately 260 students participated in career exploration activities.

- Over 260 students--ninth through twelfth graders--participated in the Virtual Upstate Business Showcase.

Testing Data

State End-of-Course (EOC) Exams

The examinations, which count 20% of the students' final grade in each gateway or benchmark course, include English 2, Algebra 1, Biology, and US History. Chapman's overall passage rate for the 2019–20 school year was above the state scores. Chapman's EOC scores indicate that students had a passage rate of 94.9% in English 1 (state 84.8%), 71.4% in Algebra 1 (state 60%), 74.2% in Biology (state 64.4%), and 82% in US History (state 66.8%).

Strategies for continued improvement on EOC scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

ACT

Seniors in the 2020 graduating class who took the ACT scored an average composite score of 20.3. Comparing this to South Carolina's 2019 scores (due to the Covid pandemic), South Carolina's average composite score was 18.8 and the national composite score was 20.7.

SAT

SAT test scores for seniors in the Class of 2020 are currently unavailable. Due to Covid and the decreased opportunities for testing, these scores are not posted on the SC Department of Education website.
