- Over 100 students participated in a Reality Fair.

Testing Data

State End-of-Course (EOC) Exams

The examinations, which count 20% of the students' final grade in each gateway or benchmark course, include English 2, Algebra 1, Biology, and US History. Chapman's overall passage rate for the 2022-2023 school year was predominately above the state scores. Chapman's EOC scores indicate that students had a passage rate of 85.47% in English 1 (state 84.04%), 60.58% in Algebra 1 (state 68.33%), 71.57% in Biology (state 59.14%), and 60.49% in US History (state 60.8%).

Strategies for continued improvement on EOC scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

The SAT average combined score for the Class of 2023 was 1081. The national average was 1003 and the state average was 1020. The ACT average composite score for the Class of 2023 was 19.3. The national average was 19.5 and the state average was 18.8.

On the Ready to Work Assessment, 78.9% of the Class of 2023 received a Ready to Work Certificate. In South Carolina, 71.6% of the Class of 2023 received a Ready to Work Certificate.
