STATE END-OF-COURSE (EOC) EXAMS

The examinations, which count 20 percent of the students' final grade in each gateway or benchmark course, currently include Algebra 1/Algebra 1B, English 1, Biology, and US History. Chapman's overall passage rate for 2010 was above the state scores. Chapman's EOC scores indicate that students had a passage rate of 78.8% in Algebra 1 (state 82.2%), 75.6% in English 1 (state 72.4%), 84.9% in Biology (state 68.1%), 54.7% in US History (state 49.6%). District One ranked 19th in the state in EOC passage rates. Strategies for continued improvement on EOC scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

HIGH SCHOOL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (HSAP) EXIT EXAM

On the state's exit exam, Chapman High School's tenth graders' average scores were higher than the state average in both Math and ELA. The CHS pass rate in ELA was 90% and 85% in math; the SC pass rate in ELA was 88.6% and 81.2% in math. The overall pass rate for CHS was 82.6% and 79.4% for SC. Strategies for continued improvement on HSAP scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

SAT

Seniors in the 2011 graduating class who took the SAT scored an average composite score in critical reading and math of 1489. South Carolina seniors' average composite score for math and critical reading was 1427 and the national composite score was 1483.

ACT

Seniors in the 2011 graduating class who took the ACT scored an average composite score of 20.3. South Carolina seniors' average composite score was 20.1 and the national composite score was 21.1.

ACCREDITATION STATUS

Chapman High School continues to maintain satisfactory accreditation status from both the State Department of Education and AdvancED. High School has been an SREB High Schools That Work site since 2008.
