2016—2017 Spotlight on Excellence

- Class of 2017 214 seniors earned their diplomas

STATE END-OF-COURSE (EOC) EXAMS

The examinations, which count 20 percent of the students' final grade in each gateway or benchmark course, include English 1, Algebra 1, Biology, and US History. Chapman's overall passage rate for the 2016-17 school year was above the state scores. Chapman's EOC scores indicate that students had a passage rate of 78.4% in English 1 (state 76.8%), 70.7% in Algebra 1 (state 74.7%), 84.7% in Biology (state 73.7%), and 79.8% in US History (state 67.8%).

Strategies for continued improvement on EOC scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

SAT

Seniors in the Class of 2017 who took the SAT scored an average composite score in critical reading, writing, and math of 1008. South Carolina seniors' average composite score for math and critical reading was 1058 and the national composite score was 1083.

ACT

Seniors in the 2017 graduating class who took the ACT scored an average composite score of 18.2. South Carolina seniors' average composite score was 18.7.

ATTENDANCE DATA

Based on the 135th day attendance count, the average daily enrollment is 877.47. The 2017-2018 percentage for student attendance is 91.72%.
