STATE END-OF-COURSE (EOC) EXAMS

The examinations, which count 20 percent of the students' final grade in each gateway or benchmark course, currently include *Algebra 1/Algebra 1B*, *English 1, Biology*, and *US History*. Chapman's overall passage rate for the 2012-13 school year was above the state scores. Chapman's EOC scores indicate that students had a passage rate of 94.6% in Algebra 1 (state 82.8%), 83.5% in English 1 (state 77.2%), 85.7% in Biology (state 78.2%), and 64.3% in US History (state 60.6%). District One ranked 12th in the state in EOC passage rates. Strategies for continued improvement on EOC scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

HIGH SCHOOL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (HSAP) EXIT EXAM

On the state's exit exam, Chapman High School's tenth graders' average scores were higher than the state average in both Math and ELA. The CHS passage rate in ELA was 93.8% and 92.4% in Math; the SC passage rate in ELA was 90.7% and 83.5% in Math. The overall passage rate for CHS was 86% and 82% for SC. Strategies for continued improvement on HSAP scores will be included in the School Renewal Plan.

SAT

Seniors in the 2013 graduating class who took the SAT scored an average composite score in critical reading, writing, and math of 1444. South Carolina seniors' average composite score for math and critical reading was 1436 and the national composite score was 1498.

ACT

Seniors in the 2013 graduating class who took the ACT scored an average composite score of 19.9. South Carolina seniors' average composite score was 20.4.

ACCREDITATION STATUS

Chapman High School continues to maintain satisfactory accreditation status from both the State Department of Education and AdvancED. Chapman High School has been an SREB High Schools That Work site since 2008.
