New Prospect Elementary has approximately 397 students with three teachers in kindergarten, second, third, fifth, and sixth grade. We have four teachers in first grade and two teachers in fourth. Additionally, our K4 classes were record size this school year. We have a morning and afternoon K4 class. At New Prospect Elementary we strive to provide our students with a student-centered education. Our staff is dedicated to making sure our students meet their learning goals. Accomplishments:

- Ann Bolton, our music teacher, was a 2021-2022 recipient of a BIG grant through the Tryon Fine Arts Center.
- Angela Bohon, our EXCEL teacher, was a 2021-2022 recipient of a BIG grant through the Tryon Fine Arts Center.
- NPE was awarded funding through the State Department of Education as an Arts in Basic School.
- McKensie Revels was named New Prospect Elementary’s 2021-2022 Teacher of the Year
- NPE was awarded funding through the Distinguished Arts Program Grant
- Outstanding Artist in Residence through ABC and DAP grants included - Asheville Contemporary Dance, Natalie Daise, and Borenya.
- MUSE Machine Partnership exposed students to different art forms, such as storytelling dance, and african folklore. Several of the performances were performed live.
- NPE had 18 students participate in the districtwide production of Little Mermaid. This was the most in the district.
- Our students and staff participated in art activities for the Youth Art Month (YAM) month.
