- Continuing P.T.O. meetings with Parent Orientation Night, Parent Help Sessions, and Family Fun Nights are held each year to enhance parent involvement .
- An annual Related Arts night promotes the importance of an overall educational program that includes art, music, and physical education.
- Mentors from the Abbeville community and Abbeville High School students assist with the Character Education and reading programs.
- Character Education is an integral part of our school. Classroom guidance, small group sessions, individual counseling, mental health services, and reward celebrations all enhance this program.
